Session availability


What's happening this term

As always, the first term of the academic year focuses on the areas to support and nurture the children to settle into Pre-School life. Separation from Parents/Carers is always a difficult and emotional time and building confidence with the children in the setting enables them to play freely, explore and enjoy the wonders of the activities on offer.

We have lots of activities on offer this term. We have lots of fun singing at circle time and listening to lots of stories.

Over the past few weeks, the children have been taking part in activities that allow them to explore themselves, their families, pets and different cultures.

> These activities are delivered through artwork, games, stories and questions and photos from home. All our learning is done through play. This week we will continue with the feelings theme, using a colour monster reference. We will be learning about rules and boundaries.





Next week we will be looking at children around the world, festivals and celebrations. Followed by seasons and of course Halloween. Halloween is always a big hit, with pumpkins and spiders and lots of spooky offerings. Bonfire night is always a colourful occasion, and it also gives us the opportunity to speak to our

children about staying safe. Then we have Christmas. Christmas is a time when our school and your home will be filled with glitter, and lots of Christmas creativity.

Remembrance Day is on the planning where the children will hear about the amazing job all the soldiers did in the war. There are lots of activities on offer for the children over this term, look out for all the photos on our face book page which is updated each week.

The outdoor area has been used well over the past few weeks although the weather has been a little damp to say the least. The children love playing in the construction area and as always, the mud kitchen is a firm favourite.

Our indoor sensory area is also an excellent place for our children to use their senses. Using lots of textures, smells, and gloop, which I am sure your child gets covered in whilst having lots of fun.

Our children are always kept busy, whether that is at a table learning new skills or simply playing and learning how to socialise with their peers. It is all extremely hard work when you are so young, but they are all lovely children, and they are doing a great job. Your children's interests are always a priority, and as always, we build these into our daily planning of activities to enable us to support their learning.

Christmas performance

Rising 5's

Our Rising 5's sessions will take place on a Tuesday and Thursday afternoon, starting from the last term in the academic year. These sessions are more focused for our 3 and 4-year olds, as we work to prepare them for school. We need to make sure that each child is ready to work in a larger group before we commence the rising 5's sessions, so in the meantime, your child's key worker will be supporting your child's progress on an individual basis or within small groups. All our learning is carried out through play. Information on the activities taking place in rising 5's will be on the wall outside the Pre-School room (on the left-hand side). We will remind you of this nearer the time.



Warm clothing

The weather has been changeable, but it looks like it has finally arrived. Autumn is truly here. The mornings are getting a bit nippy, so, with this in mind could we ask you to send your little ones in with coats, hats, gloves, and appropriate footwear. We like to

get outside no matter what the weather, so wellington boots will be a must for the wet days. Could you also remember to send in a change of clothes, just in case? On the note of clothing!! We love

messy play at Deepdale, so, please do not send your child in clothes that you do not want to get messy.

Illnesses

It's that time of year when there are lots of viruses around and we are all coming down with cold's and various illnesses. Could I please ask that if your child/children are not feeling well and are in need for some extra TLC, that you keep them at home. We would love to be able to cuddle them all day, but unfortunately, we don't have the capacity to do so, which means that your child is not getting the care that they need whilst feeling poorly. This is also the case when children have had a bad night's sleep and are very tired.

Tapestry

We will continue to follow the advice of Ofsted, which is to spend less time recording. Observations will be entered on tapestry on a half termly basis. As well as this there is a weekly observation that has an overlook on what has been happening throughout the week. Tapestry is also used to record your child's two-year old check, so please log in and have a look.

Everybody should have been sent an activation email. Many of you have already activated the log in and are already sharing your child's journal, with lovely photos and videos. If you have not got around to activating yet, then please do so as soon as you can as the activation period only lasts for 4 weeks. If you have not received an email, or if you need some support, then please call into the office.

<u>Snack</u>

Snack is provided each morning and afternoon and is a special part of the day where the staff get to spend quality time with the children. As we do not charge for consumables, we have always asked parents to help out by providing a piece of fruit a week, so if you have a spare orange, apple, banana etc, then please could you pop it in the basket on the lunch trolley, Or hand it in to a member of staff.

Breakfast Club

Just a reminder that we are running a breakfast club every morning from 8.00am-9.00am at a cost of £7.00. This can also be claimed through your government funding hours. Breakfast is included in the price. To book on, please call into the office.

Packed lunch

Please could we ask that if you send your child with **grapes** in their packed lunch that you cut them in half, length ways. This also applies to **cherry tomatoes**, **blueberries** and any other small round item. This is due to the size and shape which has been identified as a choke hazard for children. Also, we have noticed



that there is a lot of sweet foods in some of the children's pack up, and although we do not want to be telling you what your child should eat, it does make it difficult to encourage them to eat their sandwiches etc first. We currently have children with serious food allergies. We have always had a NO NUTS NO FISH policy in place, which is described in our information pack. We would like to highlight this policy to ensure that our children's health is not put at risk.
